## Scholarships & Bursaries - The Mind & Body Fund in Canada

This fund enables us to provide scholarships and bursaries to support people to obtain professional help in these areas: Identified Disabilities - this includes individuals with special needs such as

Down syndrome, Autism Spectrum Disorders, Attention-Deficit /Hyperactivity Disorders, Learning Disabilities and general intellectual/developmental delays. Mental Health Concerns - these are primarily linked to depression, anxiety disorders, and addictions. Life Issues - this includes marriage, separation, divorce, loss/grief, parenting, career exploration or change, stress management, and physical wellness. In Calgary we have been able to support clients of the Eckert Psychology & Education Centre.



### Facility Building - Mutengene Hospital, Maternity Wing in Cameroon

This facility has been a Work-In-Progress for some time. It consists of four floors (Ground plus three stories on top of it). Some of the floors are already operational; however, the top floor still needs completion

and all other floors plus the ramp have a few items left that need to be done. We encourage everyone to pitch in financially so that this project can become fully operational.



Facility Building - Mbingo Hospital Student Hostel/Residence in Cameroon Dr. Dennis Palmer writes: "God is doing amazing things at Mbingo

Baptist Hospital. The hospital has a long tradition of serving the people of Cameroon, especially the poor and those with Hanson's

Disease. Mbingo now functions as a referral hospital. [i.e.] Daily we receive patients with very complicated medical problems who seek care at Mbingo because of the high quality, compassionate care and the lower cost compared to that available in the cities. With the clinical staff we now have, we are able to provide some of the best clinical care in Cameroon for our patients. Mbingo has also developed into a teaching hospital. We are [also] beginning to move toward undergraduate medical education in conjunction with the Cameroon Christian University Medical Faculty. This means that medical students will come here for their core clinical rotations. It will give us a role in ensuring that the students are well grounded in their basic clinical skills in a Christian environment before graduating. We expect to recruit our residents from this pool ... so it will help us with our post-graduate training as well. In order to do this, we [with your help, have started to] construct a student hostel where the medical students will stay while on their rotations." More funding will be appreciated.



## Facility Building - CVM Rehab Centre in Brazil

This project is on hold at the moment. The CVM leadership is currently attempting to restructure and obtain operational funding to meet all of the new requirements imposed upon them by the Brazilian

federal and local government. Alternatively, they may try to sell this facility and deploy the proceeds in other ministries.



Facility Maintenance – HESCO, a part of CBC's Central Pharmacy in Cameroon The HESCO (Health Services Complex) Water has nationwide impact. It was initially started to meet the needs of babies and families infected with HIV & AIDS; however, the quality of the HESCO Water

and the portability of its bottle size have made it widely demanded by the public. Our Jeff Brown Team visited the Central Pharmacy in October of 2012 with the primary objective to document and analyze the various operations of this facility, and in particular, to understand and assist with the HESCO bottled water production. Since then, funding has been provided to assist with the spare parts program. One or more members of the Jeff Brown Team will be travelling to Cameroon in the spring of 2014 to carry out another inspection and to make plans for HESCO's future and to assure sustainable operations.



Orphanage – Alive Ministries / Nyamisieka Home Based Child Care Organisation in Kenya

This project is currently under review by our Mark Hawkins to determine the extend of the support required and whether adequate

"on the ground" supervisory services can be implemented. We will provide you with updated information as soon as we have carried out the "due diligence" process.
